

# \*\*\*\* AN OPPORTUNITY FOR GROWTH! \*\*\*\*

A long-term goal of Friends of Marquette Park is to fund the installation of public sculpture in Marquette Park. Pursuing this goal resulted in the creation of the Art in the Park Committee. This committee's discussions led to an agreement with Friends of Marquette Park, Miller Garden Club, the City of Gary and Chicago Sculpture International to lease two public sculptures from June 2022 - June 2024. We have surveyed residents at our events about the sculptures. Because of the popularity of Tall Ship by Bruce Niemi, we sought ways to fund the purchase of his elegant sculpture. Is it financially feasible?

As we ruminated about how we can do this financially, we were invited to apply for a match opportunity through the Legacy Foundation. On April 4, 2024, Friends of Marquette Park was awarded a Legacy Match Opportunity! We have a challenge to double our revenue and create an endowment fund. Legacy Foundation will match 1:1 each dollar donated up to \$60,000. If we raise \$60,000, Legacy Foundation will match it with \$60,000. Seventy-five percent of the total dollars raised including the match (\$90,000) will provide revenue for our projects, and one quarter (\$30,000) will establish a Friends of Marquette Park Endowment Fund. The FMP Endowment Fund principal will indefinitely perpetuate our organization, while the dividends will provide additional revenue to fund FMP projects. The Legacy Foundation is our well-respected financial manager and Northwest Indiana's trusted philanthropic foundation. This is an incredible opportunity for FMP to support and enhance Marquette Park. Now, we have a financially feasible plan!

We had a professional appraisal done where we discovered the official name of this sculpture is Tall Ship II. (Tall Ship I is nothing like Tall Ship II.) Our plan to purchase Tall Ship II involves you. Please be generous this year. Every dollar received will be matched by a dollar. Your donations at any level will bring in twice as much in 2024 and 2025! A \$100 donation becomes \$200. A \$500 donation becomes \$1,000. This match will provide additional funding to reach our goals this year.

The Legacy Match Opportunity funds will provide additional funding for all of our FMP projects. New projects include the redesign of the north and south garden areas at the Fr. Marquette Statue Garden with native and perennial plants in May, and honoring shoreline history and Indigenous people. We will continue to focus on natural areas, trail signage, points of interest, lawn improvements, lighting, walking bridges, the disc golf course and water safety.

We are so excited to have this opportunity funded by the Legacy Foundation. We hope you are too. We can't do these projects without the support of you, our donors, and Legacy Foundation.

# **FMP Projects**

**Garden Improvements** - We have chosen Mauro Crestani's landscape design for new plantings at the Fr. Marquette Statue Garden in the spring of 2024. We will be planting the week of May 13th. We always welcome volunteers. Contact Carol if you can help at pandcsmith@comcast.net.

**Public Sculpture** - Sculptor Ruth Migdal has offered to leave "Here" (red lady) in Marquette Park at no cost until she finds a new home for the sculpture. We are grateful to Ruth for allowing us to enjoy "Here" longer. We have the support of the City Administration, Park Board and Park Department for the purchase of Tall Ship II toy Bruce Niemi to remain here.

Plants and People Indigenous to Marquette Park - FMP Leaders have met with Ezekiel Flannery, PhD who talked to us about wild edibles/medicinals, ethnobotany and the Native American history of the area. Ezekiel has a background in researching the history of indigenous people to Northwest Indiana. We are considering ways to share his wealth of knowledge with you though walking tours and presentations. We have applied for a grant to fund this project. Watch for more details.

Street Light Replacement - FMP Leaders met with Mayor Eddie Melton to share the man of where street lights existed after

**Bike Racks** - We are researching the installation of more bike racks in strategic locations around the park.

Accessible Beach Walkway - A long-term goal is to fund a walkway so that everyone can experience the beach, regardless of their abilities.

**Lawn Improvement at Shelter 4 -** The area surrounding Shelter 4 has lawn around it! We had the soil amended and grass seed planted in the fall of 2023. The grass is thriving for all to enjoy. No sand burrs included.

**FMP & MGC Working Together** - We continue to collaborate with the Miller Garden Club on projects in the park. **Park Board Meetings** - FMP has a presence at the bi-weekly Park Board of Commissioners meetings. We advocate for our community and the needs in Marquette Park at each meeting. We seek approval for all of our projects through the Park Board. **Appreciation of Volunteers** - Each year more people volunteer to help with our projects and enjoy our thank you dinner.
